ADMISSION PROCEDURES

Welcome to Berchmans Academy of the Sacred Heart. We appreciate your interest in exploring a Sacred Heart education for your son and look forward to working with you throughout this process. Our school welcomes students of diverse backgrounds and faiths and is committed to the development of each student's spiritual, intellectual, physical and emotional growth.

Individual campus tours may be scheduled by contacting the Admissions Office at 337-662-5275.

To begin the admissions process, a completed application is required with a non-refundable application fee. Each applicant for admission to Berchmans Academy of the Sacred Heart is given careful consideration by the admissions committee.

CHECKLIST

The following items are required before the Admissions Committee can consider an applicant's file complete:

- **Application and Fee (\$100)**
- **Academic Records and Standardized Test Scores** - for all years your child has been in school - Parents are responsible for requesting these records directly from the child's school(s).
- **Entrance Examination** - to be taken at an individually scheduled time
- **Recommendation Forms** - to be delivered to the appropriate teachers and returned directly to the Admissions Office.
- **Small Photo of Applicant**
- **Birth Certificate and Immunization Records** - (copies)
- **Interviews** - Applicant and parent interviews will be scheduled upon testing and receipt of all items mentioned above.

PROCESS

Applications should be submitted to the Admissions Office as early as possible. You are responsible for delivering the Transcript Release(s) to your child's current and past schools. Teacher Recommendation(s) are also required and will be supplied by the Admissions Office. You are responsible for delivering these forms to the appropriate person(s) at his current school. These materials must be sent to us directly from the school/teacher. We will not accept hand-delivered items. After the application is received, we will contact you to set up a testing date. Applicant and parent interviews are the final phase of the admissions process. Interviews will be scheduled after testing and once all above-listed items are received.

Entrance exams are scheduled on an individual basis. Appointments may be made through the Admissions Office.

DEADLINES

Berchmans Academy of the Sacred Heart follows the process of rolling admissions. We ask that you submit your application with consideration for the time required to test and interview, as well as to receive his academic records and completed recommendation forms. We strongly recommend that you apply early to ensure sufficient time to complete the admissions process.

LOWER SCHOOL

THE I, II, AND III PRE-PRIMARY PROGRAM (PREK3 – 4 & KINDERGARTEN)

The I and II Pre-Primary program provides a safe and nurturing environment that addresses the developmental needs of the total child. The spiritual, physical, social, emotional, and cognitive development of each child is promoted through a concrete, play oriented approach to early childhood education. The curriculum is designed around thematic units with materials and activities chosen for their relevance to the young child's world.

In the III Pre-Primary children begin in earnest to be readers, writers, and mathematicians. They grow daily in these areas as they become active learners in the school community. The classroom environment, rich in materials to stimulate the child's natural sense of wonder, encourages learning as a whole—integrated and meaningful. The Pre-Primary curriculum includes language arts, mathematics, social studies, science, art, music, Spanish and religion. These subjects are integrated through unifying themes that spark curiosity and engage the child in active exploration.

The Pre-Primary program also includes physical education where the concepts of body awareness, motor coordination, strength, and eye-hand coordination are introduced. Games introduce the values of fair play, group participation, and cooperative play.

I, II, III PRIMARY PROGRAM (GRADES 1-3)

Particular emphasis is placed on the developmental stages of growth at each level and the learning styles of the students. The program is geared to provide a solid foundation in basic skills, and students are encouraged to integrate the material into their lives. They are encouraged to be independent and responsible learners. The following areas of study are experienced by the students in Primary grades.

RELIGION

The religion program focuses on our Catholic heritage and provides prayer experiences in class, in chapel, in liturgies, and in celebration of the feasts of the Church year.

LANGUAGE ARTS

In the Lower School language arts program, the students actively engage in reading, writing, speaking, and listening. The writing process develops from simple invented spelling and journal writing to short stories, poetry, and reports. Book writing and illustrating are seen throughout the grades, as is exposure to good literature, silent sustained reading, and group discussions.

MATHEMATICS

The goal of achieving mathematical literacy for students at Berchmans is a priority. By today's definition, mathematical literacy is having a range of sophisticated mathematical knowledge and skills that extend beyond basic calculation skills.

SOCIAL STUDIES

Students acquire knowledge and the skills to enable them to live in today's society with an understanding that history is an ongoing process. Students explore topics through discussions, field trips, guest speakers, literature, internet research, and projects.

SCIENCE

The science program at Berchmans capitalizes on the child's natural curiosity and sense of wonder. The curriculum is experiential in nature, fostering student observation and inquiry. The program stimulates the imagination and develops logical thinking skills. It shows children the importance of science in their daily lives. Children learn the procedures and skills of scientific inquiry, and hands-on activities encourage exploration and discovery of fundamental scientific concepts. Students often work together in small 'lab' groups to perform experiments that develop scientific skills.

Our 255-acre campus provides a natural laboratory for the boys to explore the flora and wildlife native to this area of Louisiana.

ENRICHMENT CLASSES

Classes in art, computer, Spanish, library, music and physical education provide opportunities for personal expression, creativity and appreciation of skills in each area.

I, II, & III PREPARATORY (GRADES 4-6)

The Sacred Heart philosophy of education mandates that learning take place in a flexible, child-centered community, that it engage the total child in the process of growth and development, and that, on all levels, it be intellectually challenging. Learning is a developmental process of interrelated elements involving the senses, imagination, and curiosity. Each Preparatory student is respected for his unique abilities, qualities, and style of learning and is expected to be motivated by intrinsic rather than extrinsic factors. He is given the opportunity to assume responsibility for his own learning, and he is challenged academically and intellectually.

LANGUAGE ARTS

The language arts program is continuous and integrated, building and expanding each year on the skills taught previously. The program combines the study/practice of grammar, research, composition, vocabulary development, communication skills, critical thinking, and public speaking.

READING AND LITERATURE

This program focuses on reading for knowledge, information, and entertainment by offering an extensive genre selection. Analysis of characterization and motivation and an expanded vocabulary are encouraged through the reading of literature chosen for its appeal to the interests of boys.

SOCIAL STUDIES

The Preparatory social studies program centers on the study of regions of the United States, ancient history from earliest humanity to the dawn of the Renaissance, and on the history of the United States through the American Revolution. Geographic concepts are reviewed, and note-taking skills are emphasized. The study of history comes alive for the students through discussions, field trips, guest speakers, literature, internet research, and projects.

SCIENCE

This program builds on the students' natural sense of wonder and desire to explore. The program utilizes technology to organize and present research findings. Students sharpen their skills of observation and prediction, and in attempting to offer explanations, they learn to communicate in scientific terms. Students explore topics in life, physical, and earth science, with an in-depth study of scientific reasoning.

Our 255-acre campus provides a natural laboratory for the students to explore the flora and wildlife native to this area of Louisiana.

ROBOTICS

Using LEGO® MINDSTORMS® Kits and NAO Robots, students design, construct, program and control fully-functioning robots through a series of real-life activities, covering topics in science, technology, engineering, and math. They use software to plan, test and modify sequences of instructions for a variety of behaviors as well as learn to collect and analyze data from sensors, using data logging functionalities embedded in the software.

ART

Instruction in the elements of art and the use of various media become more sophisticated. Aesthetic perception, creative expression, and aesthetic valuing are encouraged as students explore the principles of art.

MUSIC

The music curriculum is based on the study of the basic elements of music: rhythm, melody, harmony, form, and tone. Students experience these elements through singing, listening, and analyzing music. Students are provided with the opportunity to perform in choral concerts and yearly musicals. Private lessons for a variety of musical instruments are offered.

SPANISH

Spanish balances the four elements of language learning: listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Students increase and expand mastery of everyday vocabulary while focusing on the use of idiomatic expressions.

RELIGION

Students explore the dimensions of their own faith and are challenged to live a life of faith in today's secularized world.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Preparatory physical education is designed to ensure physical fitness and to teach the fundamentals of team games and individual sports. The activities for students improve motor skills, coordination, balance, and agility. Fair play and good sportsmanship are stressed.

UPPER SCHOOL

Berchmans Academy of Sacred Heart has long met and exceeded the TOPS requirements because our Plan of Studies is designed to provide students with a broad-based liberal arts education. Our primary curriculum goal is to honor the integrity of our Sacred Heart academic program while also meeting the requirements of external programs such as TOPS and the LDE Core Four curriculum. Curriculum decisions are based on a blend of the traditional liberal arts curriculum and the educational needs of the twenty-first century.

The Upper School operates on a semester basis. As a senior, he is required to complete IV Academic (Senior) project.

SophieConnect – In 2015, Schools of the Sacred Heart joined a consortium of Sacred Heart schools in the United States and Canada to provide students the opportunity to expand their educational experience through on-line classes. Courses vary each year depending on student requests and the availability of faculty for a specific course.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

- **Religious Education** – Weekly chapel, monthly liturgies, celebrations of special feasts, reconciliation services, retreats, and campus ministry are included in the religious education program.
- **Athletics** – Students may compete in varsity sports: 8-man football, baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, swimming, tennis, and track and field.
- **Community Service Work** – 7th, 8th and 9th grades must complete 2 opportunities of direct service and 4 opportunities of indirect or Advocacy. 10th, 11th, and 12th grades must complete 2 opportunities of direct service and 4 opportunities of indirect or advocacy.
- **Advisory Group** – Students are assigned an advisor. They meet once per week during Activity Period to discuss grades, overall academic progress, school and class issues, and issues of a personal nature.
- **Sacred Heart Exchange** – Exchange is available with the other Sacred Heart schools in the US and abroad.
- **Travel** – The school sponsors foreign travel in Europe during the school year. Students can also participate in summer network projects sponsored by schools within the Society of Sacred Heart, as well as a mission trip to Nicaragua.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Schools of the Sacred Heart provides limited financial assistance to qualifying students. Any family interested in applying for assistance should indicate this on the application. SSH utilizes the services of Financial Aid for School Tuition (FAST). Applications are completed online and can be accessed on the school website, www.sshcoteau.org. The financial assistance process is separate from that of admissions. Decisions regarding financial assistance are made only after an applicant has been accepted.

BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL CARE

Supervised care is available before school from 7:30am - 8:00am.

After school supervised care is provided five days a week, for a fee, for students PreK through 8th grade. During this time, younger students engage in play while older students use this time to complete assignments.

HOURS

School begins at 7:55am with morning assembly and dismisses at 3:15pm. Exceptions include dismissal for holidays, exam schedule and parent/teacher conferences. These times are communicated with the families as necessary.

BUS INFO - LATE BUS

Schools of the Sacred Heart provides bus service to Lafayette, Breaux Bridge, Crowley/Rayne/Church Point, New Iberia/Broussard, Opelousas, and Ville Platte/Eunice. There is also a "Late Bus" available, departing school at 5:15pm and arriving at Rouse's Supermarket in Lafayette at 5:45pm.
